



The Martial Law Act

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Article 1. The Martial Law Act

1.1 Martial Law is to be implemented to ensure the safety and security of San Andreas residents in the face of increasing criminal threats. It allows for the mobilization of state resources to maintain public order and protect the welfare of the people.

1.2 Leaders of the National Guard, Federal Investigation Bureau, Los Santos Police Department, San Andreas Highway Patrol, and Emergency Medical Service, with one representative serving as part of the Department of Justice, proclaim civil disorder in the absence of a functioning government.

1.3 Each leader of any legal organization will pinpoint two (2) representatives from his organization to represent citizens in need of a legal representative. **Note: No legal advisor can go against his own organization.**

1.4 Law Enforcement Officers shall be granted the authority to patrol the state border to ensure its security and integrity during Martial Law.

1.5 During Martial Law, Law Enforcement Officers have the right to search any citizen or vehicle that is either on state property, at a crime scene or at a property that is known for his criminal activities. They also have the right to conduct regulated border patrols at the border between Los Santos County and Blaine County

1.6 State employees are authorized to arrest individuals suspected of being terrorist members during the prime time hours of 16:00 to 20:00. However, such arrests can only be made if the individual is recognized and reasonably believed to be a member of a recognized terrorist organization.

1.7 A terrorist organization should have political, religious and/or ideological cause for their acts.

1.7.1 In order for gangs to be declared as a terrorist organization the following evidences must be collected

- Evidence of direct threats made towards the public and/or state organizations through the media
- A casefile created by the Department of Justice with 10 or more of these pieces of evidence.

1.8 The National Guard is authorized to establish checkpoints and impose a curfew during the hours of 16:00 to 21:00 in areas where the headquarters of known terrorist organizations are located.

Note: The National Guard shall never enter the actual headquarters of known terrorist organizations. Instead, they are authorized to establish checkpoints on the road or in proximity to the road leading to the HQ.

1.9 The Military Court is headed by the General of the National Guard.
