

Article 1. General provisions

1.1 This is an information leaflet on the GrandPro Bodycam which is supplied by the 24/7s of San Andreas.


1.2 The GrandPro Bodycam is an alternative for the standard bodycam procedure as stated in Article 12 of the Code of Procedures.

1.3 This Information leaflet will explain to the reader how they can use the GrandPro Bodycam to validate recordings as evidence.

Evidence can be described with examples such as, Law Enforcement Officers recording their duties, Citizens recording evidence of crimes or misconduct committed by another citizen or Law Enforcement Officer and Judiciary Officials recording evidence of a court proceeding.

Article 2. Usage Of the GrandPro Bodycam

2.1 Once a GrandPro Bodycam is activated, it is situated on the chest of the user and a red light is displayed to show it is recording. The red light is displayed like so:

2.2 The red light as shown above validates the authenticity of the recording so that it can be used as evidence. No other means of validation is required, provided the recording is made with the red light on.

2.3 A Code-A will require the user to utilize a new GrandPro Bodycam.

2.4 A user Being Rendered unconscious will require the user to utilize a new GrandPro Bodycam.

2.5 A user who wakes up in the Hospital will require the user to utilize a new GrandPro Bodycam.

Article 3. Taking the footage from your GrandPro Bodycam

3.1 Users of the GrandPro Bodycam will have to extract the footage from their bodycams.

3.2 The Grand Pro Bodycam will save all footage to the internal Memory Card. This Memory Card can be removed like so:

Akio Verlicee (8559) Ejects Memory Card from the GrandPro Bodycam

(Ejects by using /me Ejects Memory Card from the GrandPro Bodycam)

3.3 This memory card can then be stored for safekeeping or handed over to someone else for their use of the footage.
